COLE HARBOUR ARTIFICIAL FIELD UPDATE

The tender for work on the Cole Harbour Artificial Field was awarded at Halifax Regional Council on May 24. Work commenced on June 6 and will continue for the remainder of 2016.

At this time environmental controls, clearing & grubbing, removals, placement of borrow material, parking lot layout and excavation for light bases has been completed. Work is on schedule with the turf planned for installation later this summer followed by walkways/paving/parking lot/fencing/ lighting/landscaping/scoreboard and building upgrades. Official opening will be the Spring of 2017.

PARTICIPATORY BUDGETING

It was a great turnout for the inaugural Participatory Budget Community Vote. Thanks to everyone who came out and participated. Congratulations to Cole Harbour Parks and Trails who received \$4,100 for plantings and supplies, Cole Harbour Place who received \$20,000 for flooring for playground equipment, Cole Harbour Rural Heritage Society who received \$20,000 for a wheelchair and community accessible trail/ path and the Kiwanis Club of Cole Harbour – Westphal who received \$10,000 for capital upgrades to the parking lot and boat launch in their park on the Caldwell Road.

NEW DEPARTURE LINE

Halifax Transit has launched a new Departures Line that will provide more accurate departure times for our residents. As part of a significant \$43 million transit technology upgrade, the departure line real-time information is sourced from a new GPS-based vehicle location system. The GPS is currently installed on approximately 75% of our conventional buses, and will be fully operational this summer. Passengers can call a single phone number - 902.480.8000 – and by entering the bus stop number (printed on each bus stop sign) you can hear which buses are departing, and at what time.

COLE HARBOUR PARKS & TRAILS ASSOCIATION UPDATE

Cole Harbour Parks & Trails Assoc. (CHPTA) continue to expand the trail system in Cole Harbour. CHPTA



recently signed a constru**Bissett bake dirad Bridge**t the Bissett Trail with Cole Harbour Road. The

project will extend the trail which currently ends behind the Jennifer Place Apartments to Cole Harbour Road and provide a proper trail entrance with a bench, information kiosk and other amenities. The project is scheduled to start in the next few weeks and be completed by this fall.

The project proposed for next year will extend the trail from where it currently ends at Brookview Drive to the Cole Harbour Heritage Park at a point near the site of the former Red Barn. The route will extend the existing trail along the eastern end of Bissett Lake, climb the escarpment to the former hospital lands and traverse the site to the Cole Harbour Heritage Park.

The next priority is to complete the Forest Hills Trail by providing a trail head at the corner of John Stewart and Arklow Drive and continuing the reconstructed trail from where it ends behind Cole Harbour Place to Main Street.

These projects, when completed, will provide a continuous north-south trail system through the communities of Forest Hills and Colby Village providing an active transportation option to citizens to access schools, sports fields, Cole Harbour Place and many retail and private businesses. The trails are part of the Trans Canada Trail system and provide active transportation access to Cole Harbour from all the provincial and national trail systems.
