5. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Addie Burkam, **Halifax** spoke on behalf of the Climate Futures Lab Group about the importance of investing in active transportation infrastructure and affordable transportation in the Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM) and shared findings from a survey conducted by the Climate Futures Lab Group. Burkham noted the importance of investing in safe cycling infrastructure to ensure that residents have safe, reliable ways to get to where they need to go without fear and without having to rely on cars.

Cathie O'Toole, Chief Administrative Officer, and Crystal Nowlan, Director, Asset Management gave a presentation and responded to questions of clarification from Budget Committee.

THAT the Budget Committee recommend that Halifax Regional Council approve the schedule of 2024/25 advanced tender requests as per Attachment 1 of the staff report dated November 29, 2023.

Brad Anguish, Executive Director, Public Works & Chief Engineer responded to questions of clarification from Budget Committee regarding the AAA Bikeways Project and noted that projects funded from debt do not impact the tax rate until the year the projects are completed.

Jerry Blackwood, Executive Director of Finance & Asset Management/Chief Financial Officer responded to questions of clarification from Budget Committee regarding the scope of the report and noted that the Capital Budget book was forthcoming.

Peter Duncan, Director, Infrastructure Planning, John MacPherson, Executive Director, Property, Fleet & Environment, and Maggie MacDonald, Executive Director, Parks & Recreation responded to questions of clarification from Budget Committee.

MOVED by Councillor Purdy, seconded by Councillor Hendsbee

THAT the proposed capital advanced tender budget for Fire Fleet Expansion CV240003, Fire Fleet Replacement CV240004, Municipal Fleet Expansion CV240001, Municipal Fleet Replacement CV240002, Police Fleet Expansion V240005, and Police Fleet Replacement CV240006 be reduced by 50% for the 2024/2025 fiscal year.

Crystal Nowlan, Director of Asset Management responded to questions of clarification from Budget Committee.

John Traves, K.C., CD, Executive Director of Legal & Legislative Services/Municipal Solicitor/Chief Governance Officer responded to questions of clarification from Budget Committee and noted that staff needed direction on the 2024/25 advanced tender list to proceed with the rest of the budget planning process.

John MacPherson, Executive Director, Property, Fleet & Environment responded to questions of clarification from Budget Committee and noted that staff could return to a future meeting of Budget Committee with a vehicle-specific list for fleet advanced tendering.

Cathie O'Toole, Chief Administrative Officer, and Jerry Blackwood, Executive Director of Finance & Asset Management/Chief Financial Officer responded to questions of clarification from Budget Committee and noted that approval of the advanced tender list would give staff authority to start the tendering process, but that Budget Committee could make changes to the list if direction was given before contractual obligations were made.

As provided for in section 66 of Administrative Order One, *Respecting the Procedures of the Council,* the motion was withdrawn with consent of Budget Committee.
