Section 1: What is Fair Entry?

Fair Entry is an application process for City-subsidized programs and services. This process will assess your income eligibility for five City programs with one application.

What is a subsidy?

• A subsidy is a form of financial support that offers a fee reduction.

Language line available at each site if English is not your first language

How does Fair Entry help?

- You may qualify for, and learn about, City of Calgary programs and services.
- You only have to demonstrate your income situation once annually.

Recreation Fee Assistance	This program provides lower cost fees for City of Calgary Recreation facilities, golf courses, leisure centres, and access to partnering organizations. A barcode will be sent either through mail or email with instructions on obtaining your card from a City of Calgary Recreation facility.	
Calgary Transit Low Income Transit Pass Program	This program provides lower cost monthly passes for adults (18 and older), youth (6-17 years of age), and an annual pass for seniors (65+).	 Adult and youth Transit pass pricing will be determined on a sliding scale (effective April 2017). Photo ID will be required at the time of purchase. Property Tax Assistance Program	This program provides a credit/grant of the increase in property taxes; anyone who is approved will receive an additional rebate from City Waste and Recycling Services.	 Applications are accepted year-round. Applications are reviewed from June 1 to December 31 each year. Applications received after December 31 will be reviewed in June of the following year. The year in which you apply is the tax year that will be assessed. Secondary Criteria You must own the property for a minimum of one year from date of purchase. You cannot own other property. You must live in the home. You must experience an increase in your property taxes from the previous year. The homeowner must be the one paying the property taxes. 	



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Seniors Services Home Maintenance program	This program is for low income seniors (65+) to help them live safely in their homes. Services provided in designated communities.	Services for renters and homeowners include: Basic yard care; Snow removal; House cleaning. Upon program intake, homeowners may be eligible for: Painting; Minor repairs.
No Cost Spay Neuter Program	This program provides free spay and neuter for pet cats and dogs.	 You must own the dog or cat at the time of application. This program is not available for breeders. You must be 18 or older to apply. This program is offered by Calgary Community Standards.

Section 2: How do I qualify for Fair Entry?

If you are not sure if you qualify, go to a Fair Entry site, call 311, or email fairentry@calgary.ca about how you might apply or find other community supports.

We ask for three items depending on the program you are applying to:

- 1. Proof of Calgary Address (P.O. Boxes or Rural Route Addresses are not accepted)
 - A copy of your Alberta Driver's License
 - · a copy of your Alberta ID card
 - a copy of utility, telephone or cable bill dated within the last 30 days
 - a copy of a bank statement on letterhead with your name and address dated within the last 30 days
 - a copy of a government document with your name and address dated within the last 30 days
 - signed lease agreements
- 2. Proof of age (specifically for applicants to the Low income senior's annual transit pass program)
 - Birth Certificate
 - Driver's license
 - Alberta Government Identification Card
 - Alberta Health Care Card
 - Passport
 - Baptismal Certificate

Section 4: How do I Apply?

How you fill out the application depends on what proof of income you choose to use. (If you require assistance, please visit one of our in person locations listed in Section 3.)

If anyone in the household is applying with the following proofs of income, list this person as the primary applicant. See Table A:

- AISH
- Alberta Works
- Resettlement Assistance Program form
- Letter for Independent Youth
- Letter from a Registered Social Worker

If you are applying with your Notice of Assessment (or Reassessment), you and all the adult family members of your household will need to provide proofs of income. See Table B.

What do I need to know when I apply with a Notice of Assessment?

A current "Notice of Assessment" or "Notice of Reassessment" for **each** household member 18 years and over that lives with you. Total income before tax is shown on line 150 of your "Notice of Assessment" or "Notice of Reassessment". **Tax return summaries are not accepted**. If you have questions about your Notice of Assessment you can call Revenue Canada at 1-800-959-8281.

Your Total Household Income should be less than the Low-Income Cut Off (LICO) rate to qualify for Fair Entry.



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What is a household?

*Connected to page 3 under Notice of Assessment where it mentions household.

A household is **all** family members living in the same home related by blood, marriage, common-law or adoption (including children).

What is a household income?

Your household income is the **total** income of all family members 18 years or older living in the same home related by blood, marriage, common-law or adoption (including the person applying).
