Karen McKendry, Ecology Action Center (EAC), shared EAC's responses to the Regional Plan Review Themes and Directions report. McKendry pointed out needs for clarification regarding HRM's conflicting approach to Sandy Lakes and Blue Mountain Birch Cove Lakes area as growth centers but also areas of environmental protection. McKendry then proposed Charter changes for better protection of environment. McKendry concluded by highlighting importance of conceptualizing wilderness parks as opportunities to work on climate change, protect biodiversity and wilderness, and proposed park strategy.
