12.2 DANGEROUS OR UNSIGHTLY PREMISES: DEMOLITIONS 12.2.1 Case 2002 000493, 143 Myra Road, Porters Lake

The following was before the Standing Committee:

The Chair confirmed the property owner was in attendance.

Scott Hill, Regional Compliance Supervisor, gave a presentation on Case 2002 000493, property located at 143 Myra Road, Porters Lake, showing photographs of the property taken December 4, 2022, and responded to questions of clarification from the Standing Committee. Hill spoke to the state of the main structure including damage to the power mast, rotting eaves, bowing walls, and window rot.

Daniel Leon LeBlanc, the property owner provided a statement and responded to questions of clarification from the Standing Committee regarding the main structure. LeBlanc acknowledged some of the damage detailed in staff's presentation but stated that this was confined to the porch and several parts of the structure not original to the building. LeBlanc stated they wanted to remove these damaged parts of the building and inspect the structure for further damage with the hope of repairing the main structure for habitation. If this were not feasible, LeBlanc wanted to avoid demolishing the poured

concrete foundation with the intention to build a new structure on it. LeBlanc stated they had not sought permits for this work as they wanted to confirm direction from the municipality regarding possible demolitions orders. Responding to questions from Standing Committee, LeBlanc estimated that they could obtain permits within three months and complete demolition work within six months.

Tanya Phillips, Manager of By-Law Services and Karen MacDonald, Senior Solicitor responded to questions of clarification from the Standing Committee regarding the effects of deferring consideration as opposed to issuing an order for demolition with an extended timeline.

Shawn Kennedy, Residential Building Official provided information regarding the structure and foundations. Kennedy stated that the foundation and wood structure appear to be in an advanced state of decay. Parts of the building appeared to have fallen from the foundation due to rot including a spot which was not inclusive of the porch and sever bowing was occurring which was evidence of water entering the structure. Kennedy stated that a building permit would likely require evaluation from a structural engineer.

Several Councillors proposed deferring consideration for the appeal for six months to provide the property owner to perform further investigation regarding options to reconstruct the main structure and seek development permits.

MOVED by Councillor Blackburn, seconded by Councillor Deagle Gammon

THAT Case 2002 000493, 143 Myra Road, Porters Lake be deferred to the June 8, 2023 meeting of Appeals Standing Committee.
